OUTLINE OF THE CAREER OF D.M.M. NEEDHAM

Dorothy Mary Moyle was born in London on 22 September 1896. She was educated at Claremont College, Stockport, and St. Hilary's School, Alderley Edge, before passing the entrance examination to Girton College Cambridge in 1915 to study for the Natural Science Tripos. She passed Part I in 1918 and Part II, specialising in Chemistry, in 1919.

There followed research on aerobic synthesis of the muscle fuel glycogen for the Food Investigation Board of the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research, working under F.G. Hopkins and the Sir William Dunn Institute of Biochemistry, Cambridge. Dorothy Moyle received the 'title' of BA and MA in 1923 and of PhD in 1926, as women were not at the time able to receive degrees in the Senate House.

In 1924 Dorothy Moyle married Joseph Needham, a fellow worker in Hopkins's laboratory. She was awarded a Beit Memorial Fellowship for 1925-28 and during this period she did much collaborative work with her husband as well as pursuing her own lines of research. Dorothy Needham's most important work was on carbohydrate metabolism in muscle. From 1930 to 1940 she was involved in pioneering work on the part played by ATP (adenosinetriphosphate) in the contraction of muscle. For this and other research she was awarded the Cambridge University Sc.D. (1945) and elected to the Fellowship of the Royal Society (1948).

In 1940 she joined Dr. Malcolm Dixon's chemical defence research group to work on the effects of chemical weapons (mustard gas in particular) on the metabolism of skin and bone-marrow. This was followed by a period in China 1944 - 45 where Joseph Needham was Scientific Counsellor at the British Embassy in Chungking (Chongqing). Dorothy Needham was appointed Associate Director of the Sino-British Cooperation Office.

After the war Dorothy Needham returned to the Sir William Dunn Institute in Cambridge to take up work on enzyme biochemistry. Despite her great distinction she had never held an established post the University and was now supported by a short-term Medical Research Council grant, twice renewed. In 1952, however, the MRC declined to extend her grant further on the grounds that to do so would run

counter to the Council's policy of not providing long-term funding for personal stipends. The Broodbank Fund of the University awarded Dorothy Needham a grant to run 1952-55 but there were difficulties in securing further funding. An approach to the Royal Society in 1955 was unsuccessful, the President, Lord Adrian, apparently believing that it was unnecessary for married women, FRSs not, to have salaries (see A.13). However, support was forthcoming from the Agricultural Research Council and thereafter she was funded principally by the ARC for research on the proteins of smooth muscle in the uterus.

Dorothy Needham retired from active research in 1963 to work on her book Machina Carnis: the biochemistry of muscular contraction in its historical development, published by Cambridge University Press in 1971. Following this she began work on a Sourcebook for the history of biochemistry in collaboration with the historian M. Teich. This was unfinished on her death in 1987.

In recognition of her work in Cambridge Dorothy Needham was elected to the Fellowships of three Cambridge colleges; Girton, at which she was educated, Lucy Cavendish, which she helped to found in 1964, and Gonville and Caius, where she was the first woman to be admitted to the Fellowship.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

The material is presented in the order given in the List of Contents. Although by no means comprehensive there are interesting records of many aspects of her life and career.

Section A, Biographical and Personal, is the largest in the collection. It consists chiefly of personal correspondence received from friends and relatives, including a sequence of letters from her husband during his visits abroad, and material documenting Dorothy Needham's involvement with a wide range of charitable, humanitarian and political causes. There is also important correspondence relating to her career 1949-55. Other items of interest include a brief autobiographical account written for *Women Scientists: the road to liberation*, D. Richter ed. (Macmillan, 1982) and a hand-written and illustrated poem by F.G. Hopkins celebrating the Needham's marriage in 1924.

Section B, Cambridge University, comprises lectures and other teaching material for Dorothy Needham's biochemistry courses to 1963, correspondence and papers on the funding and administration of her research from 1952 and material relating to Lucy Cavendish College. A little 1930s research work found with the teaching material is also presented.

Section C, Notebooks, consists of large notebooks of varying formats used for lecture notes and drafts, bibliographical references, notes on lectures by others, research data etc., and a sequence of pocket notebooks including a set of 60 containing bibliographical references for Machina Carnis. Among the

loose items found enclosed within the larger notebooks were drafts for lectures delivered in China during the war. Also relating to Needham's work in China is a small hand-drawn map at C.78A.

Section D, Publications and Lectures, is patchy in its coverage. There are drafts and proof copies of some of Dorothy Needham's postwar publications and correspondence and papers relating to Machina Carnis. The largest body of material is correspondence, drafts and notes for the unfinished Sourcebook for the history of biochemistry. The section is completed by a short sequence of drafts of postwar lectures and a set of reprints (incomplete).

Section E, Visits and Conferences, is slight. It is a chronological sequence of material recording some of her visits and conferences between 1954 and 1979. There is also a little material from a visit to Rumania made by Joseph Needham in 1981.

Section F, Correspondence, is not extensive. It contains only two extended sequences of correspondence. As elsewhere in the collection Dorothy Needham's letters are often only represented by rough manuscript drafts. References and recommendations form a separate subsection.

Section G, Non-print Material, consists of slides for microscope work and glass photographic plates some of which were probably used to illustrate lectures.

There is also an index of correspondents.

APPEALS AND CAMPAIGNS

Needham supported a wide range of pressure groups, voluntary organisations and charities campaigning for human rights, nuclear disarmament, animal welfare etc. She also supported a number of Cambridge groups.

The material is presented in an alphabetical sequence, with some indication of the nature of Needham's involvement given where appropriate. However, many of the causes supported are not documented by correspondence but only by printed appeals annotated by Needham to indicate the response.

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INTRODUCTION

This catalogue is a supplement to that compiled in 1990 (NCUACS 22/7/90). The material has been arranged into sections and numbered to follow the sequence of the previous catalogue, which should be consulted in conjunction with this Supplementary Catalogue.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

The collection is presented in the order given in the List of Contents. Material supplementary to the 1990 catalogue has been found for the first four sections.

Section A, Biographical and Personal, comprises two new items: an undergraduate essay by Needham and a thesis completed c.1925, probably submitted for the Beit Memorial Fellowship.

Section B, Cambridge University, consists chiefly of material relating to the foundation of two Cambridge women's colleges: New Hall in 1954 and Lucy Cavendish College, the first women's graduate college in the University, in 1965. The papers reflect Needham's close involvement in their establishment through her membership of the Third Foundation Association (which campaigned for New Hall) and 'the Dining Group' (or the Society of Women Members of the Regent House who are not Fellows of Colleges) which became Lucy Cavendish College.

Section C, Notebooks, covers the period 1914-62, a time-span encompassing the whole of Needham's research career. The section includes many undergraduate notebooks used by Needham for notes on lectures and practical work for the Natural Sciences Tripos at Girton College 1915-19. All aspects of Needham's research work are documented: from post-graduate and post-doctoral research under F.G. Hopkins and work in the 1930s on ATP (adenosinetriphosphate), to wartime research on chemical defence and post-war research on enzyme biochemistry.

Section D, Publications and Lectures, chiefly consists of further material relating to Needham's book *Machina Carnis: the biochemistry of muscular contraction in its historical development* (Cambridge 1971). There is a complete typescript draft of the '2nd copy' and correspondence 1967-70 with colleagues from whom she sought advice and comments.

There is also an index of correspondents.

THIRD FOUNDATION ASSOCIATION

This Association was established in 1951 to press for the establishment of a third women's college in Cambridge. Its aim was achieved with the foundation of New Hall in 1954 and the Association was then wound up. Needham was a member of the Association through her membership of the Dining Group (see below B.40-B.47), which supported the establishment of a third foundation.

From 1953 it adopted as a formal title 'the Society of Women Members of the Regent House who are not Fellows of Colleges' and was instrumental in the creation of Lucy Cavendish College as a graduate college for women (see below B.48-B.63).

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INTRODUCTION

This catalogue of papers and correspondence of Dorothy Needham is a supplement to those compiled in 1990 (NCUACS 22/7/90) and 1992 (NCUACS 37/5/92). The material has been arranged into sections and numbered to follow the sequences of these previous catalogues, which should therefore be consulted in conjunction with this catalogue.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

The collection is presented in the order given in the List of Contents. Material supplementary to the previous catalogues has been found for sections A (Biographical and personal), B (Cambridge University), D (Publications and lectures), E (Visits and conferences) and F (Correspondence).

Section A, Biographical and personal, includes material from Needham's time in China, 1944-1945, with the Sino-British Science Cooperation Office, of which her husband Joseph Needham was Director. There is also a little personal correspondence, material relating to a number of the appeals and campaigns with which she was associated, and photographs of Needham.

Sections B, Cambridge University, and D, Publications and lectures, are very slight additions to the material in the earlier deposits.

Section E, Visits and conferences comprises principally a sequence of travel diaries spanning the period 1944-1977. They are in the form of notebooks - or loose pages from same - used for recording, usually in some detail, travel, institutions visited, contacts made and personal observations on food, social activities etc. The section also includes a little material relating to other visits and conferences 1948-1972.

Section F, Correspondence, is chiefly the contents of Needham's folder of 'Notes concerning published papers and letters'. It includes correspondence from L. H. Stickland, Jean Hanson and Lou[?is Rapkine].

There is also an index of correspondents.

LOCATIONS OF OTHER MATERIAL

Material relating to Dorothy Needham may also be found in the papers and correspondence of Joseph Needham, whose papers are deposited in the Cambridge University Library (catalogued as NCUACS 54/3/95).
